PLEASE ASSESS YOUR CHILD DAILY for SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19. We are expecting families to complete a self assessment DAILY before sending your child(ren) to school. SELF-ASSESSMENT can be located online at: https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/. Common symptoms include: fever, new or worsening cough, shortness of breath, sore throat or difficulty swallowing, altered smell or taste, nausea/ vomiting, diarrhea/ abdominal pain, running nose, nasal congestion (unrelated to allergies). If your child has new or worsening or unexplained symptoms related to COVID-19: • Do not enter the school • Seek assessment and testing ASAP • Self-isolate while waiting results • If results are negative— self-isolate for 24 hours after symptoms resolve. • If results are positive, or test is not completed, self isolate for 14 days

- School starts at 8:45 a.m., please ensure to have your children to school by 8:45 a.m.
- Supervision on our yard does not begin until 8:30
 a.m.- students can not be dropped off until that time
- Board policy states that no parents or visitors are allowed on school property (unless an appointment has been made that can't be handled on the phone or virtually). Thank you to our parents dropping off who are saying good bye at the property edge- you are making it much easier for your children and us to follow protocols.
- Kindergarten parents- we need to keep working on the 'kiss and go' process in the morning. We still have many parents hanging around in the morning which is considered 'congregating'. Also, we have other students who need to pass through the courtyard area to get to the school yard and the path for them needs to be cleared. Thank you for helping us with this so that we can continue to have kindergarten parents on the school yard.
