
As we move into month two, our staff continues getting to know the children and learners we have with us each day. We are learning about their strengths and needs. Keep asking your children about their day and learning in school.

### A few reminders...

- Board policy states that no parents or visitors are allowed on school property (unless an appointment has been made that can't be handled on the phone or virtually). Thank you to our parents dropping off who are saying good bye at the property edge- you are making it much easier for your children and us to follow protocols.
- Kindergarten parents- we need to keep working on the 'kiss and go' process in the morning. We understand that the first month is hard but as we move into October let's work towards dropping and leaving with our staff. We have many parents hanging around in the morning which is considered 'congregating'. Also, we have other students who need to pass through the courtyard area to get to the school yard and the path for them needs to be cleared. Thank you for helping us with this so that we can continue to have kindergarten parents on the school yard.
- Please do not park in the bus loading zone before/after school. In the morning we have two busses that are still arriving after the morning bell.

Also know that we will not be allowing students to run across Nairn Street to meet an adult on the other side- please cross and wait with other adults on the sidewalk.

# Please remember that we are a peanut/nut free school.

That means there should be NO tree nuts & peanuts in the ingredients. The item should also be made in a TREE NUT & PEANUT FREE FACILITY. The label can NOT say "May Contain Nuts" or made on equipment that also processes nuts, or anything similar. Peanut butter substitutes (e.g. Wow Butter) are not allowed either.

We have a number of students in the school with life threatening allergies to food products. As a result, no sharing of food will be permitted. Please refrain from sending in treats to share with the class (e.g. birthday treats) as these will be packed up and sent back home. It is our responsibility to keep everybody safe and we appreciate your support with this.

Lots of questions about Halloween at school this year... While we have yet to finalize plans, we will be celebrating Halloween in some way. We will not be able to mix cohorts (classes) and must ensure physical distancing and mask wearing regardless of it being Halloween. Costumes must follow our values and have no blood or gore and costume mask are not permitted.

Due to COVID restrictions we are unable to allow anything from home to be brought into the school to share with classes (e.g. pencils, stickers etc.) for special events/days. If something is sent, we will keep it safe and pack it up to take back home. Thank you for adhering to this and helping us to help everybody stay healthy.

This is our yearly fall reminder to regularly check your children for head lice. Students who are found to have head lice or nits will be excluded from school until treatment has been completed and they are deemed to be free of all head lice and/or nits. After treatment, parents will bring their child to school and remain while the student is examined by a trained person prior to beginning school again.

#### **Dress for the Weather**

Please ensure your children dress appropriately for the weather.....we are beginning to experience a wide variety of temperatures and conditions as fall is upon us. Classes continue to spend as much time outdoors as possible so dressing for the changing temperatures across the day is important. Also know that our field gets muddy- proper footwear and a change of clothes is always a good idea.

### **Transportation Delays/ Cancellations, are you getting notified?**

Did you know that there are ways to see if your child(ren)'s bus is running behind schedule or has been cancelled?

The ways that you can be notified of an interruption include:

- 1) downloading the bus delays app from either the Google Play or Apple store; detailed instructions on setting up the app is available by visiting <a href="http://www.stsbhn.ca/faqs">http://www.stsbhn.ca/faqs</a> and clicking on the last FAQ labelled "Delays and Cancellation App".
- 2) register to receive email notifications. To register simply visit <a href="https://transinfobhn.ca/Login">https://transinfobhn.ca/Login</a> and create and account. After your account has been created, connect your child(ren)'s bus service to your email address by logging in and clicking the "Add Student" button. Detailed instructions on setting up your account is also available by visiting <a href="http://www.stsbhn.ca/faqs">http://www.stsbhn.ca/faqs</a> and clicking on the FAQ labelled "having trouble logging into the Parent/Student portal". For parents who look up bus information before the start of school, you have already completed this option!

  3) visit <a href="https://transinfobhn.ca/Alerts">https://transinfobhn.ca/Alerts</a> daily to see if your bus is running behind schedule or has been cancelled.
